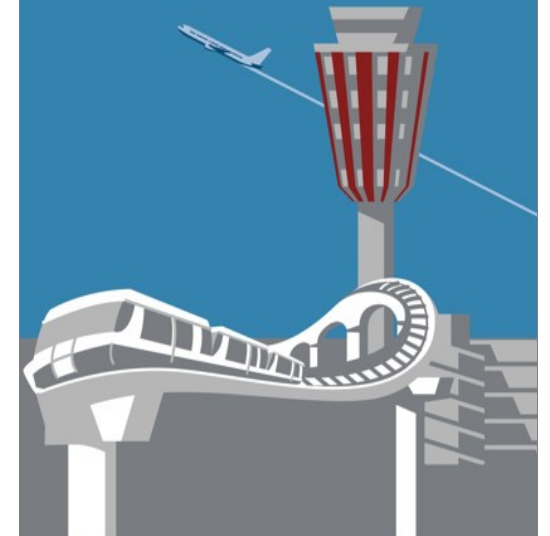

Program Description

The Safety Coordinator Program is a component of our Aviation Safety Management System. It is designed to meet the needs for collaboration and communication of our safety culture through outreach, education, safety risk management and safety assurance.

The intent of this program is to structure a focal point of collaboration for safety within organizations or work groups doing business on Airport property.

Points of Contact

Authorized signers are the initial company contact for the safety coordinator program because they are the focal point for controlled access.

Safety Coordinators should work collaboratively with the Authorized Signer for their company training, safety reporting, and workplace safety, Notice of Violations, Rules and Regulations.

Aviation Safety should not replace communications with business and properties, we enhance organizational

Tenant collaboration

- ⇒ Collaborate with Aviation Safety to ensure workplace safety standards such as our PHX Stakeholders Safety Meeting
- ⇒ Collaborate to ensure fire and life safety standards and requirements within lease areas and areas of responsibility.
- ⇒ Collaborate with Aviation Safety to ensure compliance with rules, regulations, policies and procedures while working and operating on Airport property.
- ⇒ Identify and report hazardous situations, reduce risk and ensure a positive safety culture

Construction collaboration

- ⇒ Provide construction site safety plans and sub-contractor site safety plans and procedures on request.
- ⇒ Identified hazardous situations and exposures to their employees in collaboration with Aviation Safety and DCS as necessary to reduce risk.
- ⇒ Maintain compliance with applicable OSHA, ADOSH, DOT and other regulatory and compliance agencies in collaboration with Aviation Safety and DCS as needed to reduce risk.
